

New York's highest court just ruled that the Forest Preserve cannot be over-cut and over-built for snowmobile connectors.

Such construction violated Article XIV for the same reason that the court ruled a bobsled run violated it in 1930: "Forever Wild" prohibits high-speed, artificial recreational environments.

In addition to snowmobile connectors, since 2012 DEC and APA under Governor Cuomo have:

- Permitted mining in a Wilderness (Jay Mountain);
- Constructed recreational facilities before analyzing impacts (Boreas Ponds);
- Allowed motorized maintenance of primitive bicycle trails (Essex Chain of Lakes);
- Authorized motors in Wild and Scenic River corridors (Hudson and Cedar Rivers);
- Failed to conduct carrying capacity studies of crowded Forest Preserve lands and lakes (High Peaks Wilderness, Saranac Lakes, and more).

Our courts have ruled. The mismanagement needs to end. DEC and APA should place the Preserve's care and natural resource protection first, as the law requires. Do this not just for today, but to benefit the youth of distant tomorrows.
