

The Issue:

For fifty years the Adirondack Park Agency has been charged with holding public hearings about private development of sufficient size, complexity, and public interest to warrant them. Hearings allow:

- expert testimony from the APA and the public before a hearing officer;
- evidence about project impacts and recommended ways to avoid them;
- opportunity for APA to make better land use decisions, including project denial.

The Problem:

From 1973-2011, APA held about three hearings annually until they stopped holding them. Not one public hearing has been since held since 2012 despite the APA's approval of much complex, controversial development since then.

In 2023, NYS Supreme Court in Warren County rebuked the APA for not holding a hearing before issuing a permit for an experimental herbicide in Lake George. The Judge ruled APA's failure arbitrary and irrational - and revoked the APA's herbicide permit.

Other large, complex projects, including large residential subdivisions and mine expansions, are now before the APA. We trust APA has gotten the message that it must resume hearings, but, if not, we ask for your help.
